WHAT'S NEW

Enhanced Key Cite Parameters

The WestlawNext Canada product team received the following customer request:

“Is it possible to enhance the header on Keycite lists to include the parameters of the report? Attached is a copy of a Keycite list of references I retrieved on Friday. You will note that nowhere on the report does it say what filters I applied in creating the report. If I were to hand this to a lawyer, it would look as though there are only 257 decisions citing LAC Minerals, when there are in fact, over 1,000. Also, unless the lawyer looked closely, and saw these were all “referred to” and questioned it, he might think that the decision had never been distinguished, considered, etc. By the same token, if I had limited the results to specific jurisdictions by applying filters, that would not have appeared on the report.”

This request has been answered with the addition of KeyCite parameters. Now, all selected filters will appear on the cover page of printed/downloaded Citing References lists. This eliminates any potential for confusion around the number of times a case has been cited, and how it has been treated in subsequent decisions.

Proof of Facts

Coming soon, a new module will be launched on WestlawNext Canada called “Proof of Facts”. This will be one of two new collections launching in 2019 as part of Thomson Reuters Canada’s Strategic Litigation growth initiative; the other being the “Causes of Action, Defences and Remedies” collection.

Proof of Facts is a collection of approximately 300 custom-written articles which examine the elements of proof necessary for a litigator to establish in a case. The collection is focused primarily on corporate/commercial and tort-based legal issues. Articles are prepared by Canadian research lawyers and reviewed by experienced litigation experts to ensure applicability in the Canadian context. Each Proof of Facts article follows a standard format. The key feature of these articles is the provision of the sample testimony and sample discovery questions which facilitate trial preparation and greatly reduce time spent to develop the right questions to elicit the proof necessary to establish the claim being litigated. Other features included, as applicable, are practice tips, sample pleadings and checklists. Proof of Facts allows the lawyer to focus from the outset on gathering the evidence that matters; enables her to identify any gaps in a case that warrants either deeper digging or settlement efforts; and ensures she doesn’t go to trial lacking the ability to support any salient element of her cause of action or defence ... thus enabling streamlined, efficient and thorough case preparation. This collection enables focused and thorough case preparation providing the lawyer with the legal background of the issue together with sample pleadings, checklists and sample questions for both discovery and trial aimed at drawing out the required evidence to prove that issue.
